The Koffman Incubator

The seed for the Koffman Incubator was planted in 2012, when Binghamton University teamed up with SUNY Broome, Broome County, the city of Binghamton, state and federal officials and the Koffman family to imagine a facility dedicated to providing the tools needed to advance business development in the Southern Tier.

The Koffman was opened in 2017, offering 35,000 square-feet of space built to provide a supportive environment for entrepreneurs and startup companies.

Every inch of the building has been thoughtfully designed to provide working spaces that inspire individuals and companies to create and develop transformational, innovative products and ideas.

Ideally positioned in the heart of Binghamton, NY, the Koffman serves as a hub for startup activity in the region. Housed within are the Small Business Development Center, Trade Adjustment Assistance Center and SUNY Broome's Entrepreneurial Assistance Program.

Six programs are offered to member and non-members alike to further aid in startup progression.







The Koffman Incubator

Fitting the needs of startups, the Koffman offers offices of varying size as well as laboratories. Collaborative areas are integrated throughout the building. This imaginative space has been designed to inspire member companies to connect and share ideas.




Office of Entrepreneurship and Innovation Partnerships

Binghamton Accelerator Program



The Accelerator Program is for early stage startups with promising ideas. The program provides structural resources and mentorship through a three-month set of guided courses with the goal of determining and developing business potential.

Startup founders attend 8-10 classes where they can learn the ins and outs of planning, progressing, and launching their businesses. Along with the classes, each company has individual meetings with experienced mentors in order to guide progression.

The I-Corps Program will help you evaluate product-market fit for your invention or technology through the process of customer discovery. By helping you connect with potential customers, strategic partners, and key experts, the program will inform and de-risk your pathway from innovative idea to impactful product.

Over a three-week period, you will go through a set of (virtual) workshops led by a group of experienced instructors, alongside a cohort of fellow teams. Each week, you will learn more about the customer discovery process, the business model canvas, and how to integrate these findings to bring your innovation closer to an impactful product.

Upon completion of the regional I-Corps program, participants are eligible to apply for the NSF I-Corps Team National program, an intensive 6-week training program, as well as many other funding opportunities.

XCEED



A \$750,000 federal grant from the Economic Development Administration has been awarded to Binghamton University to expand on existing programs for clean technology companies and researchers.

In line with the i6 grant's purpose of furthering ventures that translate innovations into jobs, XCEED aims to transform the Greater Binghamton Area into a center of clean technology innovation with a focus on furthering academic discoveries to the point of commercialization and supporting student entrepreneurship. XCEED provides interns, business advancement resources and prototype funding to researchers.

empowerST

Innovators in energy storage can advance their technology through a first-of-its-kind R&D and accelerator program. Through the empowerST Fellowship program, outstanding entrepreneurially-minded scientists translate their energy storage innovations into ground-breaking market-ready technologies.

Over the course of the 2-year program, the fellows receive:

- Competitive salary;
- Up to \$100,000 total support for their R&D efforts;
- Entrepreneurship training and startup support;
- Technical mentorship under world leaders in battery research, including Nobel Laureate inventor of the Li-ion battery M. Stanley Whittingham.



Soft Landings Program

The Soft Landings program provides the tools and connections needed by foreign ventures to establish a strong business foundation in the United States.

Expanding a business internationally can be challenging. Program participants receive one-on-one support to navigate the U.S. business environment., strategic connections, manufacturing leads, and legal guidance will ensure a smooth transition of your business to the U.S. market.

New York State Tax Incentives

New York agencies offer multiple programs and incentives to encourage economic growth within the state.

START-UP NY is one such program offered to new and expanding businesses. Accepted applicants can operate tax-free for ten years on or near eligible university or college campuses in New York State.

By partnering with Binghamton University through this program, businesses gain direct access to advanced research laboratories, development resources and experts in key industries – in addition to the tax incentives.
